Julia will also provide an overview of the role of the genetic counsellor in investigations for infertility, diagnosis of fetal anomalies, pregnancy loss and pregnancy after loss, and newborn screening (supported with case examples).

About the speaker:

Julia Mansour is a Certified Genetic Counsellor and a Fellow of the Human Genetics Society of Australasia. She works full time with the Tasmanian Clinical Genetics Service, which is a statewide service. Julia is based at the RHH, but sees patients at LGH twice a month. Prior to living and working in Tasmania, Julia worked as a Genetic Counsellor in Canberra and Perth. She has also worked in policy development and implementation in the Commonwealth Department of Health, and is admitted to the Supreme Court of the ACT as a lawyer.
