

Emergency Medicine Education and Training Tasmania: North west emergency department and primary care interface webinar series

What is the Emergency Medicine Education and Training (EMET) program?

The EMET program is an initiative funded by an Australian Government grant to the Australasian College for Emergency Medicine. The aim of the program is to provide teaching and training opportunities to clinical staff caring for emergency patients in primary care and rural health facilities with minimal or no consultant emergency physician support.
